Every year I think we can't be as successful as we were last year and every year I am wrong. This year has been no exception and we have gone from strength to strength. We have continued to provide exciting opportunities for our members so that they can create memories and learn new skills that will last forever.

As a county we focused a lot on technology and saw Guides take part in a region wide Robotics competition. One group in particular were very successful and ended up in the national finals in Birmingham competing against school groups from around the country. We also took part in 'Thinking Day on the air' - an opportunity for the members of Girlguiding to talk to other members of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts all over the world via Amateur Radio. We also launched our county Twitter and Instagram pages to show the public what we are achieving.

In September 2018 we launched Girlguiding's new programme - a programme that delivers a fun and varied range of activities with new topics, skills and new ways for girls to broaden their horizons with of course, plenty of badges to earn. Leaders have attended training sessions and are embracing the changes and the girls are enjoying the range of new activities on offer.

April 2019 saw a group of adults travel to Mexico to visit a Girlguiding World Centre. They had an amazing experience and whilst there took part in a programme called 'Splash into spring' which gave them some extra water based activities alongside the sessions based on current WAGGGS themes around women's rights. They also visited a Rainbow group to see the activities they engage in.

County camp at Pigdon in Morpeth provided 200 Brownies and Guides with a fun packed weekend with lots of activities such as drumming, outdoor cooking and archery. Our new ambassador Mel Petheridge came along in the evening to carry out a Clubbercise session (dancing with glow sticks in the dark) which went down well with both the girls and leaders.

We continue to raise our profile throughout North Tyneside with events such as Out and About week and Glow week,

which have proved to be so popular they are now a calendar fixture. Following on from the success of the St. Oswald's Hospice Snow Dog project, with our own Snow puppy 'WAGGGS', we are now taking part in their 'Elmer's Parade' initiative. So look out for 'Trefoilump', our Girlguiding North Tyneside elephant decorated by our members

I can't believe that it is now time for me to finish as County Commissioner. The last 5 years have been truly memorable and it has been an honour to lead Girlguiding North Tyneside. I am so lucky to have worked with such dedicated, enthusiastic and supportive volunteer


